

Jeff Stokes wins NAA Contest



Auctioneer **Jeff Stokes** (3-76) Edgewood, WA, founder & president of Stokes Auction Group, has been named Men's Division champion at the International Auctioneer Championship held in San Antonio, TX during the National Auctioneers Convention July 9, 2003. He competed with 70 other contestants demonstrating their bid-calling techniques, including clarity, speed & rhythm of their chant, appearance, poise, body language & eye contact. "I'm honored & humbled," Jeff said. "At 15, my father sent me to auction school to overcome a stutter. My family is all in the auction business. Jeff is the only person winning all 3 national championships. They include: 1987-World Champion Livestock Auctioneer, 1993- World Champion Automobile Auctioneer, & 2003- International Auctioneer Championship. Jeff was 16 when he won the WA State Championship title. Congratulations!!!!!!!!!!!!!!

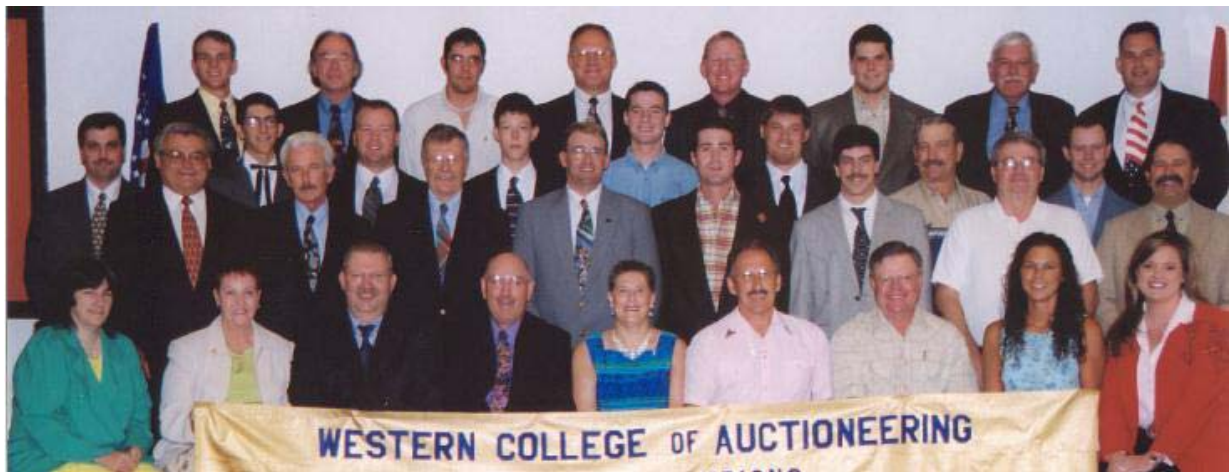
